Main Sermon Passage

Deuteronomy 6:4–9

Study Passages of the Week

Deuteronomy 1–5, 7–11; Psalm 29

Theme or Focus

Deuteronomy 1–5 recalls Israel’s journey from Horeb to the edge of the Promised Land, retelling their failures and reaffirming the covenant, including the Ten Commandments. Moses calls a new generation to remember what God has done and to respond with faithful obedience. Chapters 7–11 emphasize covenant loyalty, warning against idolatry and forgetfulness once prosperity comes. Israel is reminded that their identity and blessing flow from God’s grace and promise, not their own righteousness. Love for God is expressed through wholehearted obedience and constant remembrance.

Psalm 29 magnifies the voice and glory of the Lord, portraying His sovereign power over creation. The psalm reinforces the call to honor and worship the Lord alone.

Together, these passages stress that covenant faithfulness requires remembrance, reverence, and love demonstrated through obedience.
