Genesis 12:1–3

Study Passages of the Week

Genesis 15–18; Psalm 2

Overview

God calls Abram to leave his homeland and promises to make him into a great nation through which all the families of the earth will be blessed. This moment initiates a covenantal relationship rooted in faith and trust. The study passages trace God reaffirming His promises to Abram and Sarai and the covenant ceremony where God passes between the sacrificial pieces — a profound symbol of divine commitment.

Psalm 2 reflects on God's sovereign rule and His anointed one, which Christians later identify with Christ. It provides a royal and prophetic lens through which to understand God's unfolding plan for blessing the world through Abraham's line.
