Jeremiah 31:31–34

Study Passages of the Week

Jeremiah 16–33; Psalm 43

Theme or Focus

The New Covenant. God's Law in Our Hearts

Jeremiah 16–33 was written during one of Judah's darkest periods as the nation faced impending exile because of its persistent unfaithfulness. While these chapters contain warnings of judgment, they also reveal God's enduring commitment to restore His people and fulfill His covenant promises.

At the heart of these chapters is God's promise of a new covenant, one in which His law will be written on the hearts of His people rather than merely on stone tablets. This covenant emphasizes forgiveness, inward transformation, and a renewed relationship with God. Theologically, it points forward to God's ultimate work of redemption fulfilled in Christ.

Psalm 43 complements this theme by expressing confidence that God is the source of truth, light, and hope, even during seasons of discouragement. Together, these passages remind believers that God not only calls His people to obedience but also transforms them from within.
