

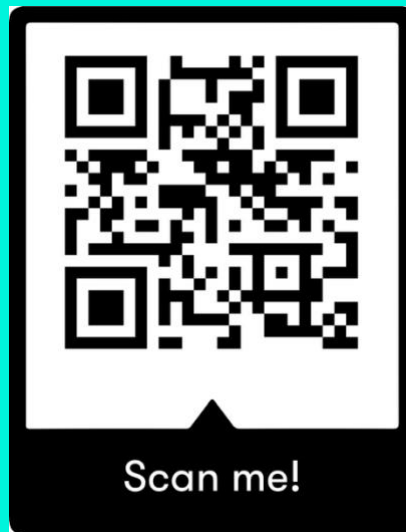

Genesis 50:15–21

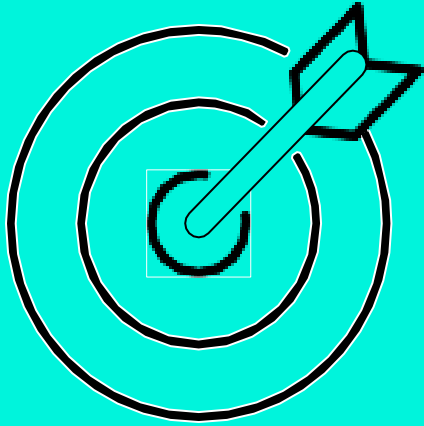
Study Passages of the Week

Genesis 37–47; Psalm 16

Theme or Focus

Joseph's story shows how God works through betrayal, suffering, and waiting to accomplish redemption. Sold by his brothers, imprisoned unjustly, and forgotten, Joseph remains faithful. Ultimately, he rises to power and forgives his brothers, uttering the famous words, "What you meant for evil, God meant for good."

This week's readings show how God preserves His people and transforms brokenness into blessing. Psalm 16 celebrates trust in God and His presence even through hardship. A fitting parallel to Joseph's journey.
