Main Sermon Passage

Isaiah 6:1-8

Study Passages of the Week

Isaiah 1-12; Psalm 40

Theme or Focus

Here I Am, Send Me – Encounter with the Holy

Isaiah 1-12 introduces the prophet Isaiah's ministry during a turbulent period in Judah's history. These chapters contain calls to repentance, warnings of judgment, and promises of future restoration. Isaiah confronts the people's outward religiosity while calling them back to genuine covenant faithfulness.

At the heart of these chapters is a vision of God's holiness and sovereignty. Isaiah's message balances judgment against sin with hope in God's redemptive plan, including promises of a coming righteous King and a restored people. Theologically, these passages emphasize that true mission begins with encountering God's holiness and responding in humble obedience.

Psalm 40 echoes this response by celebrating God's deliverance and expressing a willingness to do His will. Together, these passages highlight that God calls and sends those who have been transformed by His grace.
