Study Passages of the Week

Daniel 1–6; Psalm 47

Theme or Focus

I Knew You – The Call to Prophetic Courage

Jeremiah 1–15 introduces the ministry of the prophet Jeremiah during the final decades of Judah before the Babylonian exile. God calls Jeremiah to proclaim His word to a nation that has turned away from covenant faithfulness. Despite widespread idolatry and resistance, Jeremiah is commissioned to speak truth with courage and perseverance.

These chapters emphasize God's sovereignty, His desire for repentance, and the seriousness of persistent rebellion. Jeremiah's calling demonstrates that God equips those He sends, even when the task is difficult. Theologically, the book highlights both God's justice and His enduring desire to restore His people.

Psalm 42 complements this theme with a heartfelt longing for God in the midst of distress. Together, these passages encourage faithfulness, courage, and hope even in challenging circumstances.
